New state law mandates an A-F rating system for campuses and districts. There are 5 areas that are measured. Below is an explanation of these measures.

Student Achievement

- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Satisfactory Standard
- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Postsecondary Standard
- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Advanced Standard



Student Progress

- ◆ Students meeting progress expectations
- ◆ Students exceeding progress expectations



Closing Performance Gaps (Economically Disadvantaged)

- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Satisfactory Standard
- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Postsecondary Standard
- ◆ Students’ STAAR scores meeting the Advanced Standard

- ◆ Student attendance
- ◆ Students take advanced courses or earn college credit through dual enrollment
- ◆ Students graduating on time
- ◆ Students who earn an industry certification
- ◆ Students graduating with an advanced diploma plan
