

# **TEKS Update-Landing Page AIS-Instructional Services Zaragoza**

Welcome to the TEKS Resource System landing page video. I am logged in, and this is your landing page. Across the top, coming to this Home icon will always bring you back to this page from anywhere in the site.

You have a Standards tab, Parent Resources, District Resources, and District Tools. You have your Quick Search area, which is where you can choose your grade level and your subjects to get to your components of the curriculum. And down here at the bottom, you have a Support box, Revisions and News and Updates.

Some of the highlights I want to share with you today around your landing page is if you go to your Standards tab and you choose Download Standards, this is where we can find standards that are important to outside of the four core areas. So you have your revised Texas pre-kindergarten Guidelines here, our Texas College and Career Readiness Standards, all of our ELPS, and then we have all of the alternate essence statements. So if you have a student who is taking an alternate state assessment, this is where you can find those essence statements to support IEPs and what it is that truly special education students are responsible for mastering.

I'm going to go back up to my Home icon. And I'm going to go into my Support box. This Support box is really what I call an on-demand professional development, because here you have videos, FAQs, you can submit a request to this email address if you're having problems with the system, or you can call this 1-800 number that is manned at all times.

Your Support Library-- if you scroll down past the boxes, these are promoted articles. These are things that overarchingly people will call into the help desk for support with. So you have an administrator guy figuring out what role and permission different stakeholders in your organization have, creating a district instructional focus document, a district year at a glance, creating your own assessment-- so we have an assessment creator where you go in and create those assessments and pick and choose the questions you'd like for those-- and then creating a district assessment template.

In each one of these boxes is an area of feature guides. Recent enhancements-- this is a great place to go for each year, so you can see very quickly what's been going on with the state team to enhance and develop additional content for each of our areas. I'm going back a couple of times.

How do I get started, if I'm having a problem with the system, system management, assessment-- you can also find how to create your own assessment PDF document in there. What are the curriculum and the resource section? Here's some TCMPC videos to help you talking about that implementation tag tool.

This is brand new. Social studies put in a PLC prep social studies backward design, supporting how the social studies documents are created. Video tutorials, if you're struggling with, how do I make assessments at the district level or for the teacher?

And then these are all of our website builder support pieces. In the system, you can create your own teacher website. It's pretty easy, and these areas, these videos will support you in doing so. And then out FAQs, frequently asked questions, and again a place for you on that on-demand professional development if you're struggling with the system or needing to find something that you can't seem to be finding.

I'm going close out of this tab and return to my landing page. This Revisions box is really an interesting box, because it lists all of the revisions that have been made to this system. So when I go in, and I don't filter for anything, it'll tell you on 10/24/2016 in grade 3 there was a unit assessment item that was changed, and the change was an icon in tables to allow items to fit on one page.

You can see that there was another assessment item that the icon was changed in tables to allow to fit on one page. Same day in grade 6, there was a corrected misspelling in STEM. In grade 6, a revised table for clarity. So you can see in just chronological order from the most recent all the way to the beginning all the changes that have been made.

But let's say you're not a grade 3 or a grade 6 teacher. I am a-- let's go with high school mathematics, and let's say I'm an Algebra 1 teacher. I can filter down to specific units as well or specific components within that grade level in that course and hit List Revisions. When I hit List Revisions, because I only said high school math and algebra, it will list all of the items that have been put in the system around that big umbrella.

So you can see on 6/10/2016, multiple Algebra 1 Formative Spiral items were created in the system. If I want to know same course, same grade level, specifically unit 2 IFD, if something has changed on that specific component, I can hit List Revisions. And you can see that the last time that the Algebra unit 2 IFD was revised was May 27, 2015, and you can see those details there. This is a great place to go as you come into the system, and you're looking at documents you might have already printed to make sure that nothing has changed on them.

News and Updates is a great box for you to visit from time to time, because it will constantly be a list of items that are happening within the system. You can see here the new Social Studies Video Resource. We got a new Login and Homepage. You can look at your Content Area Updates by each of the four core areas.

You can look at the new STAAR resources. We have a new Literature for the Elementary Science Classroom in the Resource sections of K-5, both English and Spanish. The Specificity Revision Chart, the Science Content updates, Language Art revisions, and the new Language Arts STAAR resources.

This is a list that is continually being built, and as new things are added into the system, it will be put on this page for you to be aware of. Thank you for watching the TEKS Resource System landing page video.
